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Vaclav Huml utemeljitelj Zagrebačke violinističke škole

Vaclav Huml je rođen u Berounu (Češka) 18. 9. 1880. Muzičke studije završava u Pragu na Konzervatoriju 1899. g. kao učenik violinskog pedagoga svjetskog glasa Otakara Ševčika. Još za vrijeme studija Huml se nalazi u najboljem guslačkom društvu svojih kolega, djelujući kao drugi violinist u Kvartetu praškog konzervatorija 1896. godine. Prvu violinu svira Jan Kubelik – veliko ime Praške violinističke škole, violu Jiří Krejsa, a violončelo Adolf Polívka. Huml je u toku studija imao više zapaženih nastupa, što mu je i omogućilo njegov prvi profesionalni angažman kao koncertnog majstora Lavovske filharmonije, nakon što je tri godine služio obvezni vojni rok. Tako je Huml nakon završetka studija koncertni majstor filharmonije u Lavovu te koncertira po Poljskoj i Rusiji. Po dolasku u Zagreb postavljen je 11. 11. 1903. g. za učitelja violine u Glazbenoj školi Hrvatskog glazbenog zavoda (HGZ) u Zagrebu. Od osnutka Muzičke akademije 1922. g., pa sve do svoje smrti 6. 1. 1953. Huml je profesor violine na Muzičkoj akademiji, pa prema tome djeluje u Zagrebu pola stoljeća u nizu. (Vidi: Monografija VA-CLAV HUML, Zagreb, 1973.)

Humlov učitelj Otakar Ševčík najznamenitija je pojava nove Praške violinističke škole. Profesor je konzervatorija u Pragu, učitelj svjetski poznatih čeških violinskih virtuoza Kubelika i Kocijana, i pisac mnogih praktičnih pedagoških djela za violinu. Svima je poznat njegov "polutonski sistem" tj. način sviranja polutonskih intervala ponavljanjem istog prsta u nizovima, posebice kod kromatskih ljestvica. Zatim je poznat značajnim djelima "Škola violinske tehnike" (u 4 sveska, op. 1) i "Četrdeset varijacija gudalom" op. 3, te poznatim djelima "Promjena položaja" op. 8 i "Tehnika gudala" op. 2, itd.

Huml je u većem vremenskom periodu svog djelovanja u Zagrebu sljedbenik učenja svog profesora Otakara Ševčika, no kod njega se osjećaju i utjecaji Aurove violinističke škole (Petrograd 1868. – 1917.), škole koja je kasnije prevladala u čitavoj Rusiji, a znatne je utjecaje izvršila i drugdje u Europi i izvan Europe. Od 1918. g. je npr. glazbeni pedagog u New Yorku, Julliard School)) Kasnije na Humla i njegovo učenje izvjestan utjecaj čini Karl Flesch, violinistički pedagog i virtuož-interpret serije koncerata (kao npr. u Berlinu gdje izvodeći djela 65 skladatelja prikazuje povijesni razvoj violinske interpretacije i stvaralaštva). Iako ga kronike ne spominju kao učenika Josepha Joachima, on se smatra nasljednikom i čovjekom koji bitno

usavršava tradiciju Joachimove škole u Berlinu. Fleschova visoka obrazovanost, opća kultura i inteligencija dolaze do punog izražaja kod pisanja djela "Die Kunst des Violinspiels" (2 sveska) i znamenitog praktičnog djela za dnevno vježbanje "Das Skalensystem".

Tako na Humla s vremenom utječu prstometi Fleschovih ljestvica, dok se kod sviranja polotonova u kromatskim ljestvicama Huml podjednako služi Fleschovim ili Ševčikovim "poloton sistem" ("Halbtionsystem") prstometom. Ovim posljednjim naročito u kromatici kratkog trajanja unutar melodije. Huml je na taj način stvorio svoj osobni sustav, tako da mnogi naši violinski pedagozi i danas prepisuju Humlove prstomete u nove note ponovljenih izdanja Ševčikovih ljestvica iz "Škole violinske tehnike" op. 1, svezak treći. Oni su na neki način sredina između Ševčikova i Fleschova prstometa.

I tako kroz slične primjere, tijekom svog oblikovanja, koristeći tri izvora violinističkih znanja i učenja (Ševčik, Auer, Flesch), živi, djeluje i opstoji Zagrebačka violinistička škola, u prvo vrijeme poznata pod imenom "Humlova škola" (Muz. enciklopedija, pod Huml Vaclav – dr. K. Kovačević), zatim kao Hrvatska violinistička škola (Československý hudební slovník, pod Huml Vaclav – prof. dr. G. Černušák), a opisana je ukratko i kao Zagrebačka violinistička škola (L. Miranov: Metodika 1 str. 212 – 213, I katalog izložbe: Razvoj muzičkog školstva u SR Hrvatskoj – prof. J. Andreis str. 40).

Stvaranje pojma violinističke škole u Zagrebu ujedno je zasluga i profesionalnih uspjeha zagrebačkih guslača širom svijeta, kao direktni ili indirektni rezultat Humlova učenja i generacije njegovih direktnih učenika pedagoga. Prema tome, temelj Zagrebačke violinističke škole čini učenje Vaclava Humla, koji je unutar vlastite metode intuitivno počeo uklanjati krutost i neke nedostatke Ševčikova nasljeda uz utjecaje drugih škola, a ponajviše na osnovu vlastitog iskustva. Zagreb, kao jedan od centara violinističkih škola, asimilira i sintetizira postupno i poslije Humlove smrti elementa raznih škola. Ovaj razdvojeni proces u stalnom je tijeku do danas, zahvaljujući redovitim međusobnim stručnim kontaktima s nizom uglednih europskih violinističkih pedagoga što je tipično i za većinu drugih violinističkih centara u svijetu.

O Humlovu visokom ugledu svjedoče učestali pozivi iz raznih dijelova svijeta da se primi laskavih položaja pedagoga violine. Tek po dolasku u Zagreb, 1907. g. pozvan je u Odesu, gdje se u to doba

okupljaju mnogi svjetski talenti, kasnije znameniti reproduktivci, kao npr. David Ojstrah (diplomirao u Odesi kod prof. Stoljarskog). Slijedi poziv iz Ithace (država New York – USA) 1922. g. uz izvanredne uvjete na mjesto prvog profesora violine, koji je do tada držao Otakar Ševčík. Zatim je pozvan u Cincinnati (država Ohio – USA), pa u London. Zadnji poziv stiže 1947. g. iz Praga, no Huml odbija i taj zadnji poziv, iako rođeni Čeh, i ostaje u Zagrebu, siguran da je baš u Zagrebu našao svoje pravo mjesto.

Huml je pozvan i bio član žirija na natjecanjima za violinu 1935. g. u Varšavi (Henryk Wieniawski) i 1947. g. u Pragu, dok je 1937. g. bio pozvan u Beč.

O Humlu iscrpno govori monografija “Vaclav Huml”, HGZ 1973., gdje se osim sustavnog prikaza autora Z. Stahuljaka nalaze i osvrти Humlovih učenika M. Šlika, Lj. Spillera i S. Šuleka te izjave D. Plamenca i I. Pinkave, osobnosti iz kruga organizatora Memorijala Vlaclava Humla u povodu 20. obljetnice njegove smrti.

Uspjeh Humlova učenja vidljiv je i iz programa Svečanog koncerta prilikom proslave 70. godišnjice života prof. Vlaclava Humla održanog u Zagrebu u dvorani HGZ-a 4. 12. 1950., gdje se na nepotpunom popisu nalazi 91 njegov učenik, a od tog broja je 27 koncertanata i komornih glazbenika, 9 koncertnih majstora, 31 član orkestra, 7 profesora muzičkih akademija, 21 profesor muzičkih škola, sve u zemlji ili inozemstvu (podaci prema tiskanom programu).

Huml je bio jedan od osnivača i prvi violinist Zagrebačkog (gudačkog) kvarteta, osnovanog 1919. g. Stručno je nadgledao, vježbao i koordinirao rad gudačkog sastava Zagrebačkog komornog orkestra (ZKO, osnovan 1937. g.), sastavljenog od najboljih Humlovih učenika. Humlovom zaslugom, brigom i nadzorom, gudački sastav orkestra Muzičke akademije u Zagrebu u vremenu između dva svj. rata bio je na osobitoj visini i daleko nadmašio orkestre na drugim susjednim ustanovama.

Biti učenik prof. Vlaclava Humla bila je čast dodijeljena talentu koji se odlučio podvrći najstrožoj disciplini u poštivanju akademskih principa svladavanja tehnike na violini uz posjedovanje velike marljivosti. Kao uzor discipline i rada u tom poslu, zračio je kao najsvjetlijia zvijezda sam profesor Huml, boraveći od jutra do mraka uz violinu sa svojim učenicima, bilo u školi ili kod kuće. Huml nije bio samo prvorazredan majstor svog instrumenta i u prvom redu izvrstan didakt, već je njegovo djelovanje u Zagrebu imalo odlučnog

značenja za opći muzikalni odgoj, stjecanje muzičkog ukusa i smisla za interpretaciju stilova na tehničkoj bazi.

S priličnom sigurnošću može se pretpostaviti kako je izvorna Zagrebačka violinistička škola rezultat sretne simbioze dvaju odlučujućih elemenata. S jedne strane pedagoško majstorstvo, rad, marljivost i željezna disciplina, koju je Huml tražio i od svih svojih učenika, a s druge strane velik broj zainteresiranih talenata željnih znanja, napretka i uspjeha, i uvjerenih u to kako će kao Humlovi učenici najviše postići.

Vaclav Huml

The Founder of the Zagreb Violin School

Vaclav Huml was born in Beroun (Bohemia) on September 18, 1880. He did his music studies at the Prague Conservatory, finishing in 1899, as pupil of a world renowned violin teacher, Otakar Ševčík. During his studies, Huml was already in the best string company of his colleagues, taking the second violin seat in the Prague Conservatory Quartet in 1896. First violin was taken by Jan Kubelík – a great name of the Prague violin school, viola by Jiří Krejsa and cello by Adolf Polivka. During his undergraduate course, Huml made several wellregarded appearances, which led to his first professional engagement, as leader of the Lvov Philharmonic, after he had done his three years of mandatory military service. Thus after the end of his course, Huml was first violin in Lvov, and performed in concerts in Poland and Russia.

After his coming to Zagreb, on November 11, 1903 he was appointed violin teacher in the Music School of the CMI in Zagreb. From the foundation of the Music Academy in 1922 to his death on January 6, 1953, Huml was teacher of violin at the Music Academy, thus working in Zagreb for half a century. (See the monograph Vaclav Huml, CMI, Zagreb, 1973).

Huml's own teacher, Otakar Ševčík, was the most celebrated feature of the new Prague violin school. He was a professor at the Prague conservatory, a teacher of world known Czech violin virtuosi Jan Kubelík and Jaroslav Kocian, and writer of many practical teaching works for the violin. Everyone knows his semi-tone system, i.e. his manner of playing semi-tone intervals by repeating the same finger in sequences, particularly in the case of chromatic scales. Then he is known for some important works: School of Violin Technique (4 volumes, Op. 1) and Forty Variations with the Bow, Op. 3, and his important works Change of Position Op. 8 and Bow Technique Op. 2, etc.

For most of his work in Zagreb Huml was a follower of the teaching of this teacher, Ševčík, but the influences of the Auer Russian violin school (Petrograd, 1868-1917) can also be felt in him; this was a school that later prevailed in the whole of Russia, and exerted important influences elsewhere in Europe and beyond. From 1918 Leopold Auer was a music teacher in New York, at the Juilliard School. Later, a certain impact was made on Huml and his teaching

by Karl Flesch (1973 – 1944), violin teacher and virtuoso interpreter of a series of concerts (as in Berlin, for example, where he performed works of 65 composers, he showed the historical development of violin interpretation and creation). Although the chronicles do not mention him as a pupil of Joseph Joachim, he nevertheless considered himself a successor and a man who essentially rounded off the tradition of the Berlin Joachim School. Flesch's high degree of education, all round culture and intelligence came to the fore in his writing of the work *Die Kunst des Violinspiels* in 2 volumes and the celebrated practical work for everyday practice, *Das Skalensystem*.

The fingering of Flesch's scales thus over the course of time had an influence on Huml, while in the case of playing semitones in chromatic scales Huml made equally use of the Flesch and of the Ševčík semitone system (Halbtonsystem) of fingering, particularly, the last, in short-lasting chromatics within the melody. In this manner Huml created a personal system of his own, and many of our violin teachers have copied Huml's fingering into new notes of re-issues of Ševčík's scales from the School of Violin Technique, Op. 1, volume three. They are in a sense a middle way between Ševčík's and Flesch's fingering.

And so lived, worked and subsisted, in similar examples, during its formation, making use of three sources of violin knowledge and teaching (those of Ševčík, Auer and Flesch) the Zagreb Violin School, also known as the Huml School (see the entry for Huml Vaclav by K. Kovačević in the Music Encyclopaedia), the Croatian Violin School (Česko-slovenský hudební slovník, entry for Huml Vaclav – G. Černušák), also described briefly as the Zagreb Violin School (L. Miranov, Methodics 1, pp. 212-213 and the catalogue of the exhibition Development of Musical Education in Croatia – J. Andreis, p. 40).

The creation of the concept of a violin school in Zagreb is also partially to be credited to the professional successes of Zagreb string players all around the world, a direct and indirect result of Huml's teaching and the generation of his direct pupils who were new teachers. Accordingly, the foundation of the Zagreb Violin School consisted of the teaching of Vaclav Huml, who within his own method intuitively began to do away with the rigidity and other drawbacks of Ševčík's inheritance, drawing on the influences of other schools, but most of all on the basis of his own experience. Zagreb, one of the centres of violin schools, gradually assimilated

and synthesised elements of various different schools even after the death of Huml. This development process is still ongoing, thanks to regular professional contacts with many other highly reputed violin teachers, which also holds true of course for most other violin centres in the world.

Just how well regarded Huml was can be seen from the flattering invitations that streamed in from all quarters for him to take up posts of violin teacher. No sooner had he arrived in Zagreb, in 1907, than he was invited to Odessa, where many world talents were gathering

at the time, later important performers, such as David Oistrakh, who took his diploma in Odessa with P. S. Stolyarsky. Then came a call from Ithaca (New York State) in 1922, offering him outstanding terms and conditions to take up the job of first violin teacher, which had to that date been occupied by Ševčík. Then there was an invite from Cincinnati (Ohio), and from London. The last invitation, in 1947, came from Prague, but Huml turned it down as well, although a born Czech, and stayed in Zagreb, confident that it was the right place for him.

Huml was invited to be a member of the panel of judges at violin competitions in 1935 in Warsaw (the Wieniawski) and in 1947 in Prague, while in 1937 he was invited to serve in Vienna.

There is extensive discussion of Huml in the monograph Vaclav Huml, CMI 1973, where, apart from a systematic account by the present author Z. Stahuljak, there are also essays by Huml pupils M. Šlik, L. Spiller and S. Šulek, and statements by D. Plamenac and I. Pinkava, personalities from the circle of organisers of the Vaclav Huml Memorial on the occasion of the twentieth anniversary of his death, January 20 – 23, 1973 CMI.

The success of Huml's teaching is visible from the programme of the Grand Concert during the celebration of the 70th year of Vaclav Huml held in Zagreb in the CMI Hall on December 4, 1950, where on an incomplete list there were 91 of his pupils, of these 27 concertante and chamber musicians, 9 leaders, 31 members of orchestras, 7 teachers of music academies, and 21 teachers of music schools, whether at home or abroad (data taken from the printed programme).

Huml was also one of the founders and the first violin of the Zagreb (String) Quartet, founded in 1919. He supervised, rehearsed and

coordinated the work of the string section of the Zagreb Chamber Orchestra (ZKO), founded in 1937, composed of the best of Huml's pupils. It was thanks to Huml and his care and supervision that the string section of the Music Academy Orchestra in Zagreb was, during the interwar period, at a particularly high level, far surpassing that of orchestras in other, neighbouring, institutions.

To be a student of Vaclav Huml was an honour, awarded to talent that had decided to submit to the most austere discipline in the respect for academic principles in the mastering of violin technique, which also implied the possession of considerably diligence. As model of discipline and hard work in this area, Huml himself shone as the brightest star, spending all his time from dawn to dusk with his pupils, at home or in the school. He was not just a past master of his instrument and above all an outstanding teacher, but his work in Zagreb had a crucial importance for general musical education, and for the acquisition of taste and a feeling for a technique-based interpretation of styles.

With a fair degree of certainty it can be assumed that the original Zagreb Violin School was a result of the happy symbiosis of two decisive elements. On the one hand there was the craft of teaching, the work, industriousness and the iron discipline that Huml demanded from his pupils, and on the other hand a large number of interested talents that wanted knowledge, progress and success, convinced that it was the Huml students that would most of all achieve this.

Učenik Davida Oistracha i S. Snitkowskog, stekao je reputaciju virtuoznog violinista prije više od dvadeset godina. Između mnogih nagrada osvojio je Međunarodno violinističko natjecanje ARD u Münchenu i *Grand Prix* na Međunarodnom violinističkom natjecanju *Vittorio Gui* u Firenci. Nastupao je na prestižnim pozornicama kao što su *Concertgebouw* u Amsterdamu, *Carnegie Hall* i *Kennedy Center* u New Yorku, *Wigmore Hall* u Londonu, *La Salle Gaveau* u Parizu, *La Scala* u Milanu i *Santa Cecilia* u Rimu.

Posljednjih 30 godina član je *Čajkovski trija*.

Umjetnički suradnici bili su mu Sviatoslav Richter, James Galway, Alain Meunier, Patrick Gallois, Maria Tipó, Natalia Gutman, Oleg

Kagan, Yuri Bashmet, Elisso Virsaladze, Christian Zimmermann i Anthony Pay. Otvorio je Rusku akademiju visokog obrazovanja u Portogruaru i bio je umjetnički direktor glazbenog festivala Gubbio, Dubrovačkog festivala komorne glazbe i Festivala komorne glazbe u Eilatu.

Predaje i drži majstorske tečajeve diljem svijeta, u Italiji, Francuskoj, Finskoj, Španjolskoj (Escuela Superior de Música Reina Sofia Madrid), Izraelu (Akademija Rubin), Njemačkoj (Akademija Kronberg) itd. Član je žirija na međunarodnim natjecanjima (Szigeti, Kreisler, Gui, ARD–Competition u Münchenu, Sendai (Japan), Budimpešti, Sarasateu, Wieniawskom itd.).

Pavel Vernikov snimao je za RCA, Ondine i Dynamic. Bio je profesor na Nacionalnom konzervatorskom supérieur de musique de Lyon. Trenutno je profesor na čuvenom bečkom sveučilištu Konservatorium i na Visokoj školi za muziku u Lausanni (Site de Sion).

Među njegovim brojnim studentima laureatima su Massimo Quarata (1. nagrada Paganini International Violin Competition, Đenova), Fumiaki Miura (1. nagrada na Hannover International Violin Competition), Lorenza Borrani (koncertmajstor Europskog komornog orkestra), Fanny Clamagirand (1. nagrada na *Fritz Kreisler* International Violin Competition, Vienna i 1. nagrada na International Contents Violin Competition Monte Carlo) i Miki Kobayashi (2. nagrada na Wieniawski Competition i Amia Jamnicki (1. nagrada na 12. Međunarodnom violinističkom natjecanju Vaclav Huml)). Godine 2013. imenovan je umjetničkim direktorom festivala Sion u Švicarskoj. Svira prekrasnu violinu Giovannija Battiste Guadagninija, *Milano 1751*, u vlasništvu obitelji Tibora Varge.

Pavel Vernikov

A student of David Oistrach and S. Smitskowsky, he gained a reputation as virtuoso violinist more than twenty years ago. Among other prizes he won the International ARD Violin Competition in Munich and the Grand Prix at the International Violin Competition *Vittorio Gui* in Florence. He has appeared at prestigious venues such as the Concertgebouw in Amsterdam, Carnegie Hall and Kennedy Center in New York, Wigmore Hall in London, La Salle Gaveau in Paris, La Scala in Milan and Santa Cecilia in Rome.

For the last 30 years he has been a member of the Tchaikovsky Trio.

His artistic partners have included Sviatoslav Richter, James Galway,

Alain Meunier, Patrick Gallois, Maria Tipó, Natalia Gutman, Oleg Kagan, Yuri Bashmet, Elisso Virsaladze, Christian Zimmermann and Anthony Pay. He inaugurated the Russian Academy of Higher Learning in Portogruaro and was the Artistic Director of the Gubbio Music Festival, the Dubrovnik Chamber Music Festival and the Eilat Chamber Music Festival.

He teaches and gives Masterclasses around the world, in Italy, France, Finland, Spain (Escuela Superior de Música Reina Sofia Madrid), Israel (Rubin Academy), Germany (Kronberg Academy), etc. and has been invited to be a member of the jury at international competitions (Szigeti, Kreisler, Gui, ARD–Competition in Munich, Sendai (Japan), Budapest, Sarasate, Wieniawski, etc.).

Pavel Vernikov has recorded for RCA, Ondine and Dynamic. He was Professor at the Conservatoire national supérieur de musique de Lyon. At present he's Professor at the famous Konservatorium of the Wien University and at the Haute Ecole de Musique de Lausanne (Site de Sion).

Among his many laureate students are people like Massimo Quarta (1st Prize Paganini International Violin Competition, Genua), Fumiaki Miura (1st Prize Hannover International Violin Competition), Lorenza Borrani (Leader of the Chamber Orchestra of Europe), Fanny Clamagirand (1st Prize Fritz Kreisler International Violin Competition, Vienna and 1st Prize International Monte Carlo Violin Competition) and Miki Kobayashi (2nd Prize Wieniawski Competition and Amia Jamnicki (1st Prize 12 International Vaclav Hulm Violin Competition)). In 2013 he was appointed Artistic Director of the Sion Festival in Switzerland. He plays the beautiful Giovanni Battista Guadagnini violin, *Milan 1751*, owned by the family of Tibor Varga.

Eduard Wulfson



Punih trideset godina Eduard Wulfson poznat je kao eminentni profesor koji priprema nove generacije najvećih solista.

Među njegovim postignućima kao pedagoga i mentora je Kristof Barati koji gradi međunarodnu karijeru na najvišoj razini, posebno je poznat i cijenjen zbog širokog repertoara i iznimne virtuoznosti.

Od 2015. intenzivno surađuje s Danielom Lozakovichem, iznimno talentiranim glazbenikom koji je sada potvrđen kao jedan od najtraženijih međunarodnih solističkih zvijezda i koji je objavio svoju prvu senzacionalnu snimku Bachovih Koncerata za violinu za Deutsche Grammophon 2018. godine, a već 2019. i svoj drugi CD pod istom etiketom s glazbom Petra Ilijica Čajkovskog, a potom I Beethovenov koncert za violinu. Na kraju, ali ne i najmanje važno, Alexandra Conunova i Marc Buchkov također intenzivno rade pod vodstvom Eduarda Wulfsona od 2017. odnosno 2018. i postaju najprofiliranijim solistima.

Nakon intenzivnog rada s Eduardom Wulfsonom prije nekoliko godina, Sacha Rojdestvenski sada ne samo da svira u najvećim koncertnim dvoranama diljem svijeta, već je i vodeći profesor na prestižnom Ženevskom konzervatoriju.

Popis glazbenika s kojima je prof. Wulfson radio uključuje mnoge koji su osvojili glavne nagrade na najprestižnijim međunarodnim natjecanjima poput onih u Parizu, Bruxellesu, Moskvi i Ženevi...

Eduard Wulfson

For thirty years, Eduard Wulfson has been known as an eminent professor helping to prepare new generation of the greatest soloists.

Among his achievements as pedagogue and mentor are Kristof Barati who is forging an international career at the highest level, especially known and appreciated for his large repertoire and extreme virtuosity.

Since 2015, he has been intensively working with Daniel Lozakovich, an extremely talented musician who is now confirmed as one of the most demanded international superstar soloist and who released his first sensational Bach's Violin Concertos recording with Deutsche Grammophon in June 2018. Daniel has recorded his second CD Tchaikovsky album with Deutsche Grammophon on 2019 and Beethoven Violin concerto on 2020.

Last but not least, Alexandra Conunova and Marc Buchkov work also intensively under the guidance of Eduard Wulfson since respectively from 2017 and 2018 and become among the most profile soloists in the world.

After an intensive work few years ago with Eduard Wulfson, Sacha Rojdestvenski, not only plays now in the major concert halls all around the world but is also a leading professor in the prestigious Geneva Conservatory.

Prof. Wulfson's list of musicians whom he worked with, includes many who have won major awards in the most prestigious international competitions such as in Paris, Brussels, Moscow and Geneva...

Goran Končar



Rođen je 1954. u Zagrebu i jedan je od najistaknutijih hrvatskih violinista, studirao je na Muzičkoj akademiji u Zagrebu kod Martina Barića i Josipa Klime, a magistrirao 1978. u razredu Leonida Kogana na Konzervatoriju Čajkovski u Moskvi. Usavršavao se kod Maxa Rostala u Bernu i Henryka Szerynga u Ženevi, te potom kod Yfraha Neamana u Londonu čiji je asistent od 1981.– 83. na Guildhall School of Music. Od 1988. profesor je na Muzičkoj akademiji sveučilišta u Zagrebu. Drži majstorske tečajeve u Madridu, Berlinu, Torinu,

Milanu, Sidneyu, Tokyu, Pekingu, Stellenboschu i drugdje. Godine 2004. pokreće LAUS akademiju u Dubrovniku zajedno s najvećim svjetskim violinističkim imenima. Međunarodnu solističku karijeru započeo je 1982. gostujući u većini europskih zemalja, SAD-u, Japanu, Koreji i Izraelu. Od 1984. do 1994. bio je koncertni majstor Royal Philharmonic Orchestra u Londonu, Simfonijskog orkestra Hrvatske radiotelevizije i Zagrebačke filharmonije. Koncertirao je s uglednim orkestrima i dirigentima diljem svijeta.

Dobitnik je prvih i posebnih nagrada na državnim natjecanjima u zemlji, nagrade Glazbeni život u Moskvi (1980.) za izvedbu Koncerta za violinu i orkestar Dmitrija Šostakovića, prve nagrade na Međunarodnom natjecanju u Bratislavi (1984.) te drugih visokih priznanja. U popisu nagrada osobito se ističe Nagrada Vladimir Nazor (2006.). Prvu mu je ploču izdao EMI 1984. u Londonu, a snima za BBC, CBS, France Musique, HRT, Vox Primus te druge radijske i televizijske postaje. Croatia Records je objavila jednu od rijetkih integralnih izvedbi solo violinskih sonata Eugène Ysaÿea.

Od 1987. do 2012. vodi *Zagrebački kvartet* te punih četvrt stoljeća svoje umijeće i umjetnost ugrađuje u postojanje ovog najdugovječnijega, ne samo hrvatskog već i europskog komornog sastava.

U svom profesionalnom djelovanju posebnu pažnju posvećuje proučavanju zvuka povijesnih instrumenata kao i osvještavanju vrijednosti tonskog drveta iz Hrvatske i Bosne od kojeg su izrađivani najvredniji instrumenti.

Niz godina svirao je i na na violini Giovanni Battista Guadagninia koju je hrvatski violinist i skladatelj Stjepan Šulek ostavio fondaciji Šulek kao i na violini Giuseppea Guarneria del Gesùa *King* iz 1735. Zlatka Balokovića, danas u posjedu HAZU.

Goran Končar

One of the most prominent Croatian violinists (b. 1954), studied at the Music Academy in Zagreb with Martin Barić and Josip Klima, and obtained a master's degree in the class of Leonid Kogan at the Tchaikovsky Conservatory in Moscow in 1978. He also studied with Max Rostal in Bern and Henryk Szeryng in Geneva, then with Yfrah Neaman in London. He was Neaman's assistant at the Guildhall School of Music from 1981 to 1983. He has been teaching at the Music Academy of the University of Zagreb since 1988. He has held

masterclasses in Madrid, Berlin, Turin, Milan, Sidney, Tokyo, Beijing, Stellenbosch and elsewhere. In 2004, he started the LAUS Academy in Dubrovnik together with the world's greatest violinists. His international solo career began in 1982 with guest performances in majority of European countries, as well as USA, Japan, Korea and Israel. From 1984 to 1994 he was the concertmaster of the Royal Philharmonic Orchestra in London, Croatian Radio Television Symphony Orchestra and Zagreb Philharmonic. He has performed with renowned orchestras and conductors all over the world.

He won first and special prizes at national competitions, as well as the Music Life Award in Moscow (1980) for his performance of Shostakovich's Concerto for violin and orchestra, the first prize at the International Competition in Bratislava (1984) and numerous other accolades. Among the awards received Vladimir Nazor Award (2006) holds a prominent place.

His first record was released by EMI in 1984 in London, and he recorded for BBC, CBS, France Musique, HRT, Vox Primus and other radio and TV stations. Croatia Records released one of the rare integrated performances of Eugène Ysaye's solo violin sonatas. From 1987 to 2012 he managed the *Zagreb Quartet* and for a full quarter of a century his skill and art were part of this oldest Croatian and European chamber ensemble.

Professionally, he is dedicated to studying the sound of historical instruments and raising awareness of the value of tonal wood from Croatia and Bosnia that was used to make the most valuable instruments.

For a number of years he played on Giovanni Battista Guadagnini's violin which the Croatian violinist and composer Stjepan Šulek left to the Šulek Foundation as well as on the violin *King* by Giuseppe Guarneri del Gesù from 1735 of Zlatko Baloković that is in possession of the Croatian Academy of Sciences and Arts (HAZU).

Anđelko Krpan



(Zagreb, 1967.) diplomirao je violinu na *Muzičkoj akademiji* u Zagrebu, u razredu Kristijana Petrovića 1989., te magistrirao na *Hochschule für Musik und darstellende Kunst* u Beču u razredu Dore Schwarzberg 1995. godine. Bio je član *Bečke komorne filharmonije* (1993.–97.), član *Zagrebačkih solista* (1993.–97.), koncertni majstor *Zagrebačkih solista* (1997.–2002.), koncertni majstor *Orkestra HNK iz Zagreba* (2002.–2006.), a od 1995. do danas predaje violinu na *Muzičkoj akademiji* u Zagrebu. Dobitnik je reda *Danice Hrvatske s likom Marka Marulića*, nagrade *Milka Trnina*, Hrvatskog društva glazbenih umjetnika i nagrade *Lisinski* Hrvatskog društva skladatelja. Jedan je od utemeljitelja i prvi violinist Gudačkoga kvarteta Sebastian. Redovito svira i snima solistički i u različitim komornim sastavima. Do sada je snimio 15 CD-a za izdavačku kuću Croatia Records. CD Hrvatske sonate, koji je snimio u suradnji s pianisticom Nadom Majnarić, osvojio je diskografsku nagradu Porin. Povodom 30 godina rada Gudačkog kvarteta *Sebastian*, izdavačka kuća Leykam International je 2020. objavila monografiju *Gudački*

kvartet Sebastian — Naših 30 godina autorice Gordane Krpan, a njemačka izdavačka kuća cpo CD Kvarteta Sebastian sa skladbama B. Kunca, F. Lhotke i J. Štolcera Slavenskog.

Andelko Krpan

(Zagreb, 1967.) graduated in Violin at the Academy of Music in Zagreb in the class of Kristijan Petrović (1989) and went on to earn his masters at the *Hochschule für Musik und Darstellende Kunst* in Vienna in the class of Dora Schwarzberg (1995). He has been a member of the *Vienna Chamber Philharmonic* (1989–93), then member of the *Zagreb Soloists* (1993–97), orchestra leader of the Zagreb Soloists (1997–2002), concertmaster of *Croatian National Theatre Orchestra of Zagreb* (2002–2006) and has been teaching Violin at the Academy of Music in Zagreb since 1995. He was officially decorated with the *Croatian Morning Star Order with the Image of Marko Marulić*. He received the Croatian Society of Music Artists *Milka Trnina* Award for his exceptional artistic achievements and the *Porin Prize* for the CD *Croatian Sonatas* recorded in collaboration with the pianist, Nada Majnarić. In 2019. he received the Croatian Society of Composers *Vatroslav Lisinski* Award for promotion of music by Croatian composers. He recorded 15 CDs for Croatia Records label. He is one of the founders and the first violinist of the *Sebastian String Quartet*. In the occasion of 30 years of *Sebastian String Quartet*, the monography by Gordana Krpan is released: *Sebastian String Quartet — Our 30 Years*. German CD label cpo released a CD by *Sebastian String Quartet* with compositions by B. Kunc, F. Lhotka and J. Štolcer Slavenski.

Kimiko Nakazawa



Nakon studija u razredima Shin-ichi Suzuki i Yosiho Unno, diplomiра на Свеучилишту Niigata у Јапану. Zahvaljujući stipendiji japanske vlade usavršavala se u Beču i Salzburgu godine 2000. Такoder je studirala kod L. De Barueri na *Mozarteumu* u Salzburgu. Godine 1991. osniva ansambl Beč-Tokio. Solističke nastupe između ostalog održava u dvoranama Carnegie Hall, Vienna Concert House i Beethoven Hall u Bonnu. Nastupala je s mnogim svjetskim orkestrima kao Tokijskom filharmonijom, Bečkim komornim orkestrom i dr. Za nosače zvuka snimila je cjelokupan opus violinskih sonata W. A. Mozarta s Joerg Demusom na klaviru te, isto tako, Mozartovih violinskih koncerata pod ravnanjem Philippea Entremonta. Njezini su

Kimiko Nakazawa

After studying with Shin-ichi Suzuki and Yosiho Unno graduated from Niigata University in Japan. She continued her studies in Vienna supported by the Encouraging Artists Program by Agency of the Japanese Government in 2000. She also studied with L. de Barueri at the *Mozarteum* in Salzburg. In 1991 she founded the ensemble Vienna-Tokyo. Among many renowned venues Kimiko Nakazawa has performed in recitals in the Carnegie Hall, Vienna Concert House and Beethoven Hall in Germany. She has performed many concerts with famous orchestras including the super World Orchestra, Tokyo Philharmonic Orchestra, Nagoya Philharmonic Orchestra and Vienna Chamber Orchestra. She has also appeared in programmes for NHK FM and TV. Among her numerous recordings and CDs she has released the complete Mozart Sonatas for violin and piano with the pianist Joerg Demus in 2003 and more recently the complete Mozart Concertos for violin and orchestra with Philippe Entremont conducting. While performing in concerts Kimiko has also become known for her master classes with young violinists who are encouraged to lead the next generation of talents in their art. Her students won first awards at the state competitions in Japan in 2006 and 2007. She plays on an exceptionally valuable Antonio Stradivari violin called *Romanov*.

Leonid Sorokow



Rođen je 1954. u Rusiji. Na prve poduke iz violine polazi s 5 godina. Pohađa Specijalnu glazbenu školu Konzervatorija u St. Petersburgu. Od 1973. do 1978. studira na Moskovskom konzervatoriju kod J. Jankelevića i J. Čugajeve, a majstorske radionice pohađa kod V. Klimova. Sorokow 1979. osvaja prvu nagradu na Međunarodnom natjecanju u Montrealu, 1981. osvaja drugu nagradu na Natjecanju Paganini u Genovi. Kao solist koncertirao je na turnejama po Rusiji, Mađarskoj, Italiji i Finskoj, a na raznim kocertima komorne glazbe nastupa s D. Sitkovecky, O. Kagan, N. Gutman, J. Bashmet, D. Geringas, K. Kashkashian i dr. Od 1986. — 1992. koncertni-majstor je Moskovskih solista pod vodstvom J. Bashmeta. Sudjelovao je na svjetskoj turneji tog ansambla, također i kao solist, a u 1992. kao umjetnički voditelj. Od 1991. Leonid Sorokow živi u Beču, a

od 1993. predaje na Muzičkoj akademiji u Beču. Od 2001. profesor je na Muzičkoj akademiji u Zagrebu. Od 1996. — 2007. član je bečkog *Mozart trija*. 2009. osnivač je i član zagrebačkog *Trija Amadeus*. Član je ocjenjivačkog suda međunarodnog violinističkog natjecanja *Vaclav Huml* 2013. 2017. i 2021.

Leonid Sorokow

Was born in 1954 in Russia. He took his first violin lessons at the age of five. He attended the Special Music School of the St. Petersburg Conservatory, From 1973 — 1978 studies at the Moscow Conservatory with J. Jankelevich and J. Tchugayeva, master-classes with V. Klimov. In 1979 Sorokow was prize-winner at the International Competition in Montreal, in 1981 won second prize at the Paganini Competition in Genoa. Sorokow toured Russia, Hungary, Italy and Finland as a soloist and was the partner of D. Sitkovecky, O. Kagan, N. Gutman, J. Bashmet, D. Geringas, K. Kashkashian and others at various chamber concerts. From 1986–1992 he was a concert-master of the *Moscow Soloists* under J. Bashmet. He took world-wide tours with the ensemble, also as a soloist, and in 1992 as artistic director. Since 1991 Leonid Sorokow has lived in Vienna, and since 1993 he has taught at the University of Music in Vienna and since 2001 he has been a professor at the Music Academy in Zagreb. From 1996–2007 he was a member of the *Vienna Mozart Trio*. Since 2009 he was co-founder and member of the *Amadeus Trio Zagreb*. He was member of the Jury on the International *Vaclav Huml* Violin Competition in 2013, 2017. and 2021.

Elly Suh



Hvaljena kao „osjetljiv i upjecatljiv interpret“ (Musical America), korejsko-američka violinistica Elly Suh ističe se kao violinistica čiji glazbeni šarm, interpretativna originalnost i jedinstvena kreativna vizija udahnuju novi život djelima na koncertnim pozornicama diljem svijeta. Suh se slavi kao jedna od vodećih interpretatorica svoje generacije Paganinija i trenutno radi na velikom projektu snimanja *24 capricia za solo violinu* Niccolòa Paganinija. Odražavajući njezin moderni kreativni duh i inovativan pristup glazbi, projekt *Paganini Vault* je narativni audiovizualni album – koji služi kao samo jedan primjer njenog suptilnog ali uvjetljivog širenja uvriježenih granica i očekivanja klasične glazbe, dok gazimo dublje u 21. stoljeće.

Uz svoje šarmantne interpretacije glavnih djela violinske literature, Elly Suh prepoznata je i kao izvođač suvremenih djela za violinu – po-

sebno onih Maria Davidovskog, Neda Rorema i Jörga Widmanna. I sama talentirana skladateljica i glazbeni aranžeri, Suh unosi individualnost i jedinstven kreativni glas u sve svoje nastupe – često kroz novokomponirane kadence, improvizacije ili orkestralne aranžmane poznatih i nepoznatih djela. Njezina kadanca za Mozartov *Koncert za violinu br. 4* u polufinalu Natjecanja za violinu Kraljice Elizabete u Belgiji (2019.) – koja je uključivala belgijsku nacionalnu himnu – dobila je ogromnu popularnost i široko priznanje kritike, pojavljujući se na nekoliko velikih televizijskih informativnih kanala.

Suh redovito sudjeluje na natjecanjima od 2012. godine, kada je osvojila drugu nagradu na Međunarodnom natjecanju violinista u Naumburgu u New Yorku. Od tada je osvajala Grand Prix, glavne nagrade ili posebne nagrade na više od deset međunarodnih natjecanja, uključujući Međunarodno natjecanje violinista *David Oistrakh* u Moskvi, Rusija (2013.), Međunarodno natjecanje violinista *Premio Paganini*, Italija (2015.), Međunarodno natjecanje violinista *Michael Hill*, Novi Zeland (2015.), Međunarodno natjecanje violinista Bach u Leipzigu, Njemačka (2018.) i Međunarodno natjecanje violinista Indianapolsa, SAD (2018.), između ostalih.

Tijekom studija u New Yorku, Suh je redovito djelovala kao gostujuća koncertna majstorica s Orkestrom Američkog baletnog kazališta. Sada je međunarodna solistica, a njezini nedavni i nadolazeći angažmani uključuju Korejski komorni orkestar, L'Orchestra della Fondazione Teatro Carlo Felice, Leipzig Pauliner Barockensemble, New York Classical Players, Orchestre Royal de Chambre de Wallonie i Komorni orkestar Lviv Virtuosos.

Na koncertima je nastupala na pozornicama poput BOZAR Brusels, Carnegie Halla i Lincoln Centra, te na Salzburger Festspieleu – vodećem svjetskom festivalu klasične glazbe.

Rođena u Seulu 1989. godine, Suh je počela svirati violinu s pet godina. Odmah prepoznata kao osoba s izrazitim talentom, upisala se na predfakultetski odjel Juilliard School u New Yorku sa samo 10 godina. Pod mentorstvom eminentnih profesora, uključujući Roberta Manna, Joela Smirnoffa i Sally Thomas, stekla je prvostupničku i magistrsku diplomu glazbe na Juilliard School, prije nego što je započela poslijediplomski studij na Manhattan School of Music. Nakon toga, Suh se preselila u Europu kako bi pohađala poslijediplomski studij na Sveučilištu Mozarteum u Salzburgu pod vodstvom proslavljenog violinista Pierrea Amoyala.

Elly Suh živi u Londonu i svira na violini Guarneri del Gesù koju je velikodušno posudio anonimni mecena, uz ljubaznu pomoć tvrtke Florian Leonhard Fine Violins.

Elly Suh

Praised as “*a sensitive and absorbing interpreter*” (Musical America), Korean–American violinist Elly Suh stands out as a performer whose musical charm, interpretative originality, and unique creative vision breathe fresh life to concert stages around the world.

Suh is celebrated as one of the leading Paganini interpreters of her generation, and is currently undertaking a major recording project of Niccolò Paganini’s *24 Caprices for Solo Violin*. Reflecting her modern creative spirit and innovative approach to music, the *Paganini Vault project* is a narrative audio–visual album – serving as just one example of Suh’s subtle but compelling expansion of the traditional boundaries and expectations of classical music, as we move further into the 21st century.

Alongside her charming interpretations of the major works of the violin literature, Elly Suh is recognised as a major exponent of contemporary works for violin – in particular those by Mario Davidovsky, Ned Rorem, and Jörg Widmann. Herself a talented composer and musical arranger, Suh brings individuality and a unique creative voice to all her performances – often through newly composed cadenzas, improvisations, or orchestral arrangements of both known and unknown works. Her self-composed cadenza for Mozart’s *Violin Concerto No. 4* in the semi-finals of the Queen Elisabeth Competition for Violin, Belgium (2019) – which incorporated the Belgian National Anthem – was received with enormous popularity and wide critical acclaim, appearing on several major televised news channels.

Suh has been a regular on the competition circuit since 2012, when she took Second Prize at the Naumburg International Violin Competition, New York. Since then, she has gone on to take either the Grand Prix, Top Prizes, or Special Prizes at more than ten international competitions, including the Moscow International David Oistrakh Violin Competition, Russia (2013), Premio Paganini International Violin Competition, Italy (2015), Michael Hill International Violin Competition, New Zealand (2015), Leipzig International Bach Competition, Germany (2018), and the International

Violin Competition of Indianapolis, USA (2018), amongst others.

Whilst studying in New York, Suh worked regularly as Guest Concertmaster with the American Ballet Theatre Orchestra. Now an international soloist, recent and forthcoming engagements include the Korean Chamber Orchestra, L'Orchestra della Fondazione Teatro Carlo Felice, Leipzig Pauliner Barockensemble, New York Classical Players, Orchestre Royal de Chambre de Wallonie, and the Lviv Virtuosos Chamber Orchestra.

In concert, she has appeared on such stages as BOZAR Brussels, Carnegie Hall, and the Lincoln Center, and performed at the Salzburger Festspiele – the world's premier classical music festival.

Born in Seoul in 1989, Suh first began violin lessons at the age of five. Instantly recognized as possessing a fiercely prodigious talent, she went on to enter The Juilliard School's Pre-College Division in New York at just 10-years-old. Under the tutelage of eminent professors including Robert Mann, Joel Smirnoff, and Sally Thomas, she went on to obtain both her Bachelor's Degree and her Masters of Music at The Juilliard School, before embarking on post-graduate studies at the Manhattan School of Music. Following this, Suh moved to Europe to undertake post-graduate studies at the Mozarteum University of Salzburg under the guidance of the celebrated violinist Pierre Amoyal.

Elly Suh lives in London, and plays on a Guarneri del Gesù violin on generous loan from an anonymous patron, through the kind assistance of Florian Leonhard Fine Violins.

Osim njih, mnogi su proslavljeni domaći i inozemni dirigenti usnuli svoj pečat u nju tijekom proteklih desetljeća poput Leopolda Stokowskog, Paula Kletzkog, Sir Malcoma Sargenta, Kurta Sanderlinga, Carla Zecchija, Milana Sachsa, Krešimira Baranovića, Borisa Papandopula, Jakova Gotovca, Stjepana Šuleka, Milka Kelemenja, Krzysztofa Pendereckog, Dmitrija Kitajenka, Lorina Maazela, Leopolda Hagera, Valeryja Gergijeva, Sir Nevillea Marrinera...

Jednako tako, Zagrebačka filharmonija je pružila gostoprимstvo i brojnim vrhunskim instrumentalnim i vokalnim solistima od Milke Trnine, Yehudija Menuhina, Antonija Janigra, Mstislava Rostropovića, Leonida Kogana, Henryka Szeringa, Luciana Pavarottiјa, Ive Pogorelića, Montserrat Caballe, Alexandera Rudina, Davida Garretta, Juliana Rachlina, Mischa Maiskog i mnogim drugima.

Orkestar je nastupao u gotovo svim zemljama Europe, u Rusiji, Ukrajini, SAD-u, Meksiku, Izraelu, Japanu, Južnoj Koreji, Kini, Omanu, Kuvajtu i Argentini.

U veljači 2016.g. i na najprestižnijoj američkoj glazbenoj adresi, njujorškom Carnegie Hallu, a u posljednjem desetljeću je čak četiri puta zaredom održati svečane koncerte u novogodišnje ju tro u čuvenoj dvorani Festspielhausa u Salzburgu.

Zagrebačka filharmonija je ostvarila vrlo bogatu diskografiju za ugledne kuće poput *Virgin Classics*, *Deutsche Grammophon*, *Naxos*, *Parma Recordings* i *Oehms Classics*, te za *Jugoton* i *Croatia Records*. Zagreb Philharmonic Orchestra

The Zagreb Philharmonic Orchestra is a symbol of a 150–year tradition of orchestral performance in Zagreb and Croatia, and it has long stood at the forefront of musical life in Croatia, while serving as a cultural ambassador of Croatia on the world stage as well. It stands as one of the city's most recognisable emblems – a musical institution that embodies the City of Zagreb's identity as a Central European centre of music, art, and culture.

The orchestra's distinguished history has been shaped by renowned chief conductors including Friedrich Zaun, Milan Horvat, Lovro von Matačić, Mladen Bašić, Pavle Dešpalj, Kazushi Ono, Pavel Kogan, Alexander Rahbari, Vjekoslav Šutej, David Danzmayr, and its current chief conductor, Dawid Runtz.

Over the decades, many celebrated Croatian and international conductors have also left their distinctive mark on the orchestra, among them Leopold Stokowski, Paul Kletzki, Sir Malcolm Sargent, Kurt Sanderling, Carlo Zecchi, Milan Sachs, Krešimir Baranović, Boris Papandopulo, Jakov Gotovac, Stjepan Šulek, Milko Kelemen, Krzysztof Penderecki, Dmitri Kitayenko, Lorin Maazel, Leopold Hager, Valery Gergiev, and Sir Neville Marriner.

The Zagreb Philharmonic has also had the honour of hosting numerous outstanding instrumental and vocal soloists, including Milka Trnina, Yehudi Menuhin, Antonio Janigro, Mstislav Rostropovich, Leonid Kogan, Henryk Szeryng, Luciano Pavarotti, Ivo Pogorelić, Montserrat Caballé, Alexander Rudin, David Garrett, Julian Rachlin, Mischa Maisky, and many others.

The orchestra has performed in nearly every European country, as well as in Russia, Ukraine, the United States, Mexico, Israel, Japan, South Korea, China, Oman, Kuwait, and Argentina.

In February 2016, the orchestra made its debut at the most prestigious musical venue in the United States, New York's Carnegie Hall, and in the past decade alone, it has been invited on four consecutive occasions to give New Year's morning gala concerts at the renowned Festspielhaus in Salzburg.

The Zagreb Philharmonic has produced an extensive catalogue of recordings for prestigious labels such as *Virgin Classics*, *Deutsche Grammophon*, *Naxos*, *Parma Recordings*, and *Oehms Classics*, as well as for *Jugoton* and *Croatia Records*. At the same time, a special focus

has always been placed on preserving the legacy of Croatian composers, both past and contemporary.

Throughout its history, and continuing to this day, the Zagreb Philharmonic has actively participated in a variety of musical and charitable events in the city whose name it bears, and it has also received the City of Zagreb Award on multiple occasions.

It remains deeply committed to nurturing young audiences and musicians – through diverse initiatives in its *Minimini concert cycle*, long-standing collaborations with the Croatian Musical Youth and the Music Academy, and its prestigious *Young Musician of the Year* award, presented for more than three and a half decades.

In its Friday Night Concert Series, the orchestra will gladly venture outside the traditional classical repertoire, offering its audience unique musical experiences, from crossover concerts with Maksim Mrvica and performances with Vlatko Stefanovski, to evenings devoted to tango, fado, and Charlie Chaplin; as well as Dan Brown's *Wild Symphony* for children, and music from *Star Wars* and *Harry Potter*. Because music must be experienced, felt – *FEELharmonic*.

Pavle Zajcev



Hrvatski dirigent, violončelist i pedagog Pavle Zajcev ponajviše je poznat kao solistički, komorni i orkestralni glazbenik. Violončelo je diplomirao 1998. na Muzičkoj akademiji u Zagrebu u klasi prof. Valtera Dešpalja nakon kojeg se usavršavao na poslijediplomskom studiju na Muzičkoj akademiji u Baselu u klasi prof. Ivana Monighettia.

Kao solist je nastupao uz Zagrebačku filharmoniju, Simfonijski orkestar HRT-a, Hrvatski komorni orkestar, Varaždinski komorni orkestar, Dubrovački simfonijski orkestar i Samoborske gudače te je bio finalist 2. Međunarodnog violončeliističkog natjecanja *Antonio Janigro* 2000. godine. Sljedeće godine prizvao je *Koncert za violončelo i gudače* Pavla Dešpalja sa Zagrebačkim solistima te ga snimio sa Simfonijskim orkestrom Hrvatske radiotelevizije pod ravnateljem skladatelja, za koji je osvojio nagradu Porin u kategoriji za najbolju izvedbu.

Kao komorni glazbenik nastupa u raznim sastavima te surađuje s

mnogim umjetnicima, kao što su Julian Rachlin, Mischa Maisky, Torleif Thedeen, Lawrence Power, Gordan Nikolić, Đuro Živković, Edin Karamazov, Pavao Mašić, Dmitrij Sinkovsky, Krešimir Stražanac, Krešimir Špicer i dr. Godine 1997. osniva Zagrebački klavirski trio u kojem djeluje do 2014., a s kojim je sudjelovao na seminarima Isaaca Sterna, Leona Fleishera, Juilliard i Emerson kvarteta, kvarteta Borodin, Grieg trija, Sandora Devicha (Bartók kvartet), Milana Škampe (Smetana kvartet). S triom je osvojio brojne nagrade na međunarodnim natjecanjima te održao koncerte u Hrvatskoj, Njemačkoj, Nizozemskoj, Austriji, Sloveniji, Srbiji, Izraelu, Kanadi, Poljskoj i Norveškoj.

Od 2010. djeluje kao stalni suradnik ansambla *Antiphonus* pod vodstvom Tomislava Fačinija s kojim 2018. osvaja nagradu *Judita* na Splitskom ljetu. Od 2002. – 2010. bio je solo-čelist u Simfonijskom orkestru HRT-a. Od 2005. radi kao docent, a od 2013. kao izvanredni profesor na Muzičkoj akademiji u Zagrebu (komorna glazba). Dirigiranjem se počeo baviti 2011. kada je ostvario svoj debi s Gudačkim orkestrom HGM-a u Grožnjanu čiji je dirigent i umjetnički ravnatelj bio od 2011. – 2014. Dirigentske nastupe ostvario je s Gudačima Simfonijskog orkestra HRT-a, Samoborskim gudačima te Dubrovačkim simfonijskim orkestrom s kojim godinama redovito surađuje. Studirao je godinu dana u klasi Uroša Lajovica te je 2017. upisao studij dirigiranja na Muzičkoj akademiji u Zagrebu u klasi Mladena Tarbuka i Tomislava Fačinija. Kao student prve godine dirigirao je izvedbom opere W. A. Mozarta *Cosi fan tutte*, a početkom 2019. premijerom scenske izvedbe ciklusa pjesama G. Mahlera *Des Knaben Wunderhorn*, u objema s ansamblom Muzičke akademije za koje je nagrađen Rektorovom nagradom. Godine 2018. dirigirao je ansamblom *Antiphonus* na Međunarodnom zborskem festivalu *Cro Patria* u Splitu. U prosincu 2019. prvi je put surađivao s Hrvatskim narodnim kazalištem Ivan pl. Zajc u Rijeci, dirigirajući novom produkcijom Čajkovskog baleta *Orušar* u režiji Maura de Candie. Povodom 250. obljetnice rođenja Ludwiga van Beethovena dirigirao je Simfonijskim orkestrom Hrvatske radiotelevizije u sklopu ciklusa *Kanconjer*, a debitirao je i sa Zagrebačkom filharmonijom dirigirajući studentskim koncertom na Muzičkoj akademiji u Zagrebu. Redovito snima za Hrvatsku radio-televiziju.

Pavle Zajcev

(Zagreb, 1976) graduated in cello from the Zagreb Academy of Music in 1998 under Valter Dešpalj and continued his postgraduate education at the Basel Music Academy under Ivan Monighetti.

He has appeared as a soloist with the Zagreb Philharmonic Orchestra, the Zagreb Soloists, the Croatian Radio and Television Symphony Orchestra, the Croatian Chamber Orchestra, the Varaždin Chamber Orchestra and the Dubrovnik Symphony Orchestra.

He was a finalist in the 2nd International Cello Competition Antonio Janigro in Zagreb in 2000. The following year, he premiered Pavle Dešpalj's Concerto for cello and strings with the Zagreb Soloists and recorded it with the Croatian Radio and Television Symphony Orchestra conducted by the composer, for which he won the Porin Award in the category of Best Performance.

As a chamber musician, he has performed in various ensembles, and in 1997 he founded the Zagreb Piano Trio with pianist Srebrenka Poljak and violinist Vlatka Peljhan. The trio won the Darko Lukić Competition in 1998 and second prize in the Charles Hennen International Chamber Music Competition in the Netherlands. In September 2000 they won first prize in the 1st Trondheim International Chamber Music Competition in Norway. The Trio has performed in Croatia, Germany, the Netherlands, Austria, Slovenia, Serbia, Israel and Norway. From 2010 to 2014 they appeared as the Zagreb Trio, composed of violinist Martin Draušnik, pianist Daniel Detoni and cellist Pavle Zajcev, performing at festivals in Trieste, Osor, Dubrovnik, Toronto, Ottawa, Montreal and Warsaw and at the International Chamber Music Campus in Weikersheim, Germany.

As a chamber musician, he appeared at numerous festivals and collaborated with artists such as Julian Rachlin, Mischa Maisky, Torleif Thedeen, Lawrence Power, Gordan Nikolić, Đuro Živković, Edin Karamazov, Pavao Mašić, Dmitry Sinkovsky, Krešimir Stražanac, Krešimir Špicer and others. He has been a permanent associate of the Antiphonus Ensemble, led by Tomislav Fačini, since 2010.

He was solo cellist with the Croatian Radio and Television Symphony Orchestra from 2002 to 2010; in 2005 he became Assistant Professor at the Zagreb Academy of Music, where he has served as Associate Professor of chamber music since 2013.

He made his debut as a conductor in 2011 in Grožnjan, Croatia, with the Croatian Musical Youth String Orchestra, where he served as conductor and Artistic Director from 2011 to 2014. In this period he occasionally conducted the Samobor Strings, the Croatian Radio and Television Symphony Orchestra Strings and the Dubrovnik Symphony Orchestra, where he has been a regular guest conductor ever since. In 2017, he began his conducting studies under Mladen Tarbuk and Tomislav Fačini at the Zagreb Academy of Music. In 2018, he conducted the Antiphonus Ensemble at the International Choral Festival Cro Patria in Split. In December 2019, he collaborated with the Croatian National Theatre Ivan Zajc in Rijeka for the first time, conducting the new production of Tchaikovsky's ballet The Nutcracker, directed by Mauro de Candia. On the 250th anniversary of Ludwig van Beethoven's birth, he conducted the Croatian Radio and Television Symphony Orchestra as part of the Kanconijer series, and made his debut with the Zagreb Philharmonic Orchestra conducting a student concert at the Zagreb Academy of Music. He regularly records for Croatian Radio and Television.

Stefan Burchardt, mladi danski violinist rođen u Odensi 2003. godine, počinje svirati violinu s četiri godine. Debitirao je kao solist s Simfonijskim orkestrom Odense 2011. godine i od tada gradi karijeru i kao solist i kao komorni glazbenik. Stefan je nastupao s poznatim orkestrima poput Danskog nacionalnog simfonijskog orkestra, Simfonijskog orkestra Odense i Simfonijskog orkestra Sønderborg, te je nastupao na prestižnim mjestima, uključujući Komornu dvoranu Berlinske filharmonije, Beethoven Haus Bonn i Carl Nielsen Hall u Danskoj. Dobio je brojna priznanja, uključujući prve nagrade na Flame Concours Paris, nagradu Hans Schauble (2020.) i Øresunds Solist (2019.), JuMu (2019.), kao i nagradu Talent i zlatnu medalju na Berlinskom glazbenom natjecanju. Dobitnik je nagrada na natjecanju Eugene Ysaÿe 2019. godine i finalist natjecanja L. van Beethoven u Berlinu. Stefan je započeo svoje glazbene obrazovanje s pet godina kod Alexandra Zapolskog u Kopenhagenu, gdje je studirao gotovo desetjeće, uključujući i vrijeme u MGK Copenhagen. Kasnije je radio s učiteljima poput Helgea Slaatta i Sergaya Aziziana. S trinaest godina primljen je u Institut Julius Stern na Sveučilištu umjetnosti u Berlinu kod profesorice Latice Honda-Rosenberg. Godine 2019., sa šesnaest godina, započeo je preddiplomski studij kod profesorice iste profesorice. Nakon što je završio preddiplomski studij u Berlinu, preselio se u Lausanne u Švicarskoj gdje trenutno pohađa magisterij na HeMu kod prof. Svetlane Makarove, kao i u Beču kod prof. Pavela Vernikova. Stefan je nastupao na festivalima poput Kronberg Academy, Aurora Festivala, Old Ox Sweden i Encuentro de Santander. Godine 2019. osvojio je 1. nagradu na Jugend Musiziert u Njemačkoj, a iste je godine nagrađen nagradom Hermann Abs za najbolju interpretaciju djela L. van Beethovena, gdje je bio pozvan da svira u Beethoven Haus u Bonnu u Njemačkoj. Stefan Burchardt, born in Odense in 2003, is a young Danish violinist who began playing the violin at the age of four. He made his debut as a soloist with the Odense Symphony Orchestra in 2011 and has since established a career as both a soloist and chamber musician. Stefan has performed with renowned orchestras such as the Danish National Symphony Orchestra, Odense Symphony Orchestra, and Sønderborg Symphony Orchestra, and has appeared at prestigious venues including the Berliner Philharmonie's Chamber Hall, Beethoven Haus Bonn, and Carl Nielsen Hall in Denmark. Stefan began his musical education at the age of five under Alexandre Zapolski in Copenhagen, studying there for nearly a decade, including time at MGK Copenhagen. He later worked with teachers such as Helge Slaatto and Sergey Azizian. At the age of 13, he was accepted into the Julius Stern Institute at the Universitä der Künste Berlin under Professor Latica Honda–Rosenberg. In 2019, at the age of 16, he commenced his bachelor studies with Professor Honda–Rosenberg. After completing his bachelor's degree in Berlin, he relocated to Lausanne, Switzerland, where he is currently pursuing a master's degree at HeMu under Prof. Svetlana Makarova as well as in Vienna with Prof. Pavel Vernikov. Stefan has also been featured at festivals like the Kronberg Academy, Aurora Festival, Old Ox Sweden, and Encuentro de Santander. In 2019 he won 1st prize at Jugend Musiziert in Germany and was the same year awarded the Hermann Abs–Prize for the best interpretation of a piece by L. van Beethoven, where he was invited to play in the "Beethoven Haus" Hall in Bonn, Germany. The concert was recorded and broadcast on German radio by WDR for the "Beethoven Year 2019". Other accolades include the recognition as an "EMCY" Soloist and In 2017, he was named Denmark's "Wunderkind" on Danish Radio's "Wonderkids." Stefan is also an enthusiastic chamber musician who has performed a wide variety of chamber music pieces with well-established musicians such as Hartmut Rohde, Bruno Philippe, Ensemble Midtvest, Jonian Ilias Kadesha and Alissa Margulis. Stefan has received essential inspiration through masterclasses with prominent teachers such as Dora Schwarzberg, Pavel Vernikov, Zakhar Bron, Olivier Charlier (Paris Conservatoire), Maciej Rakowski, Alf Richard Krägerud, Malin Broman amongst others. Driven by his passion for music, he continues to work on his abilities both technically and musically.

Litvanska violinistica **Ugnė Liepa Žuklytė** debitirala je solo s orkestrom u dobi od osam godina, a s dvanaest je izvela Mendelsohnov Koncert za violinu u e-molu s Litvanskim nacionalnim simfonijskim orkestrom. Osvojila je brojna nacionalna i međunarodna violinistička natjecanja te je za svoja postignuća nagrađena *Medaljom kraljice Morte*.

Počasni dirigent Litvanskog nacionalnog simfonijskog orkestra, prof. Juozas Domarkas, rekao je: *Iznimno je darovita i ozbiljna mlađa umjetnica s izvrsnim prirodnim tehničkim i emocionalnim osobinama, a što je najvažnije, ozbiljnim stavom prema temi glazbe koju izvodi, kao i originalnom idejom skladatelja, što je rijetko reprezentativno za glazbenike mlađe dobi.*

Ugnė je sudjelovala na majstorskim tečajevima kod renomiranih violinista i profesora, uključujući Maxima Vengerova, Zakhara Brona, Borisa Garlitskog, Lynn Chang, Pavela Bermana, Miriam Fried, Marianne Piketty, Eszter Haffner, Sergeja Krylova, Francescu Dego i Alinu Ibragimovu. U ljetu 2024. godine, Ugnė je dobila punu stipendiju za sudjelovanje u šestotjednom programu stipendiranja na Međunarodnom glazbenom festivalu Bowdoin u Maineu, SAD. Trenutno je ABRSM stipendistica na magistarskom studiju kod profesorice Lyutsie Ibragimove na Kraljevskom glazbenom koledžu u Londonu. Tijekom prediplomskog studija u Londonu, Ugnė je dobila nagradu Henry Wood Accommodation Trust i nagradu Harrison–Frank Family Foundation. Godine 2024. imenovana je stipendisticom Londonskog simfonijskog orkestra.

Lithuanian violinist **Ugnė Liepa Žuklytė** made her solo debut with orchestra at the age of eight and performed Mendelsohn's Violin Concerto in E Minor with the Lithuanian National Symphony Orchestra at twelve. She has won numerous national and international violin competitions and was awarded the *Medal of Queen Morta* for her achievements.

Honorary conductor of the Lithuanian National Symphony Orchestra, prof. Juozas Domarkas, has said: *She is an exceptionally gifted and serious young artist with excellent natural technical and emotional features, and most importantly, a serious attitude towards the subject matter of the music she is performing, as well as the original idea of the composer; which is rarely representative of musicians of a young age.*

Ugné has participated in masterclasses with renowned violinists and professors, including Maxim Vengerov, Zakhar Bron, Boris Garlitsky, Lynn Chang, Pavel Berman, Miriam Fried, Marianne Piketty, Eszter Haffner, Sergey Krylov, Francesca Dego and Alina Ibragimova. In the summer of 2024, Ugné was awarded a full scholarship to participate in the six-week fellowship program at the Bowdoin International Music Festival in Maine, US. She is currently an ABRSM Scholar pursuing her master's degree with Professor Lyutia Ibragimova at the Royal College of Music in London.

During her bachelor studies in London, Ugné received the Henry Wood Accommodation Trust Award and the Harrison–Frank Family Foundation Award. In 2024 she was named the London Symphony Orchestra Conservatoire Scholar.
